# Horizons - Earth and Water Marie Lund

In Horizons – Earth and Water works in two very different media are brought together to offer insights into the natural world. Marie Lund's sun prints artfully reflect nature in their genesis but, as in nature itself, ultimately rely on chance and the happy coincidence of the elements. Not so her digital colour prints, where their outcome is more precisely decided by the artist's discerning eye and command of technique.

Describing herself as a landscape artist, Marie Lund says 'From my childhood, nature became my best friend. It offers me not only desired freedom, but also everlasting inspiration and retreat. The wonderful world around me full of little sensations always removes me from the ordinary'.









From my first experience of Marie Lund's work more than fifteen years ago I have seen many variations on this and other themes. Her interests traverse a wide range of subjects, including the grand nature images in *South*—a 2011 Huw Davies Gallery exhibition with Trevor Lund coming out of an epic photographic adventure to the Antarctic in 2009—to micro details of the built environment included in a number of PhotoAccess Members Shows and the 2007 exhibition *Door Handles and Keyholes* at The Hive Gallery in Braddon. Marie's first PhotoAccess solo exhibition was the 1997 *Chocolate Box Pictures* in our Kingsley Street premises.

Marie Lund's creative interests reflect a life immersed in the visual arts.

Born in Prague, Marie completed studies in art education with a Doctorate in Pedagogy. She was a full-time art and photography teacher for more than twenty years in Australia, Europe and Asia and has a long history of wider involvement in the arts—as a photographer, painter and mixed media artist. Marie has been a member of professional and community associations in Canberra and elsewhere, including PhotoAccess, the Canberra Photographic Society and, in recent years, the Eurobodalla Photographic Society, Creative Arts Batemans Bay and the South Coast Pastel Society. Articles about her work have appeared in The Canberra Times, Batemans Bay Post and Sunraysia Daily, Mildura.

Marie Lund's *Simple Alchemy* exhibition in the Huw Davies Gallery in 2010 was a major departure from the beautiful landscapes and streetscapes we were used to seeing at PhotoAccess, and the first we saw of her sun prints. As she said then in her Artist Statement, the images in *Simple Alchemy* were created without a camera, generated by sunlight: 'It is the process of experimentation that interests me, where the joy of creation takes over the desire for perfection'. In the catalogue introduction I observed that this work brought '... together her interest in photographic processes and her wider fascination with creative media. Obviously control of the technical means of creation is happily subsumed to the prospect of a chance effect, the sometimes more interesting than expected outcome that can come from making images direct to paper and, even more chancy, taking them out of the darkroom'.

So too the sun prints in *Horizons – Earth and Water*, where objects placed on the paper lose definition to the more nuanced shapes and tones created by moving sun. While they are visually striking overall, the prints invite close inspection so their individual elements can be identified, sometimes with surprising results.

Marie says of the colour prints in *Horizons – Earth and Water* '... (in these images) of my world, be it mud, tree, pond, soil, I am inviting the viewer to become co-creator and to see the beautiful in the ordinary'. These are some Marie Lund's most successful images to date. They are carefully and thoughtfully composed, offering a micro and sometimes semi-abstract view of things at the margin of earth and water. The clarity of vision and precise selection and placement of details adds up to a series of works that are visually appealing and speak to a wider theme, that of the importance of the natural world. Through her work Marie Lund is an advocate for the natural world. These images are easily relatable and strikingly beautiful, a gentle reminder of what we stand to lose if mismanagement of the planet upsets the fragile ecosystems that make our natural places so special.
